General Information

Set-Up & Display Guidelines

Enclosed is a schedule with times for set up, registration, and public hours. Upon arrival at the Kenan Center Arena, please check in and pick up your Registration Packet at the information booth before setting up. Motor vehicles are not allowed in the Arena building. There are garage doors on the east side of the building which will be opened during unloading. You may also unload at the front (north) entrance. A limited number of hand trucks will also be available for your use in unloading and set-up. Please do not park vehicles in front of garage doors! Once you have unloaded, please move your vehicle to any available space.

All display areas are exactly the same size: 10' x 10'. No wall partitions or tables are provided. Booth space outline and booth number will be chalked on the Arena floor when you arrive for set-up. Your assigned space is indicated on the enclosed floor plan. Booths were allocated in the order of receipt of your reservation forms. Substitutions were necessary when requested spaces were already assigned. It will NOT be possible to switch booth assignments because materials have been printed with your assigned booth number.

The jurors expect that the level of professionalism of your display matches that of your work. **Signs indicating sales (including buy 1, get 1 free; ½ off today), seconds or price negotiability are strictly prohibited!** Please be sure that unsightly backs and sides of your partitions are covered from public view. Extra boxes and bags should be kept out of sight. These materials should not be allowed to detract from you or your neighbor's display. Co-chairs will go around at 3:00 p.m. on Friday, June 4th and compare your booth setup to the booth slide you submitted for jurying. New this year, juror Thomas Stender, will offer a free-of-charge professional booth critique for interested artisans beginning at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, June 4th. Please see enclosed for more information.

Booths and artwork **MUST BE REMOVED** by 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 6, 2010.

Electricity & Your Booth

Arena lighting may be sufficient for some artisans, but you may want to supplement with your own booth lights. There is a 500-watt maximum on electrical use. Artisans who exceed the limit may cause blown circuits, inconveniencing others. Those found not complying will be required to reduce their usage to acceptable limits. To get equivalent lighting with less power consumption, you may want to purchase General Electric's "PAR-FL-WM" lamps. The "WM" stands for WATT MISER, the magic words. These watt misers are available in many sizes. Other brands may also be on the market. We strongly suggest that you bring a plug-in strip and an extension cord at least 25 feet long.

Security

The Arena building is equipped with an electronic security system in operation when the building is empty. There will also be a security guard on the premises from: 9:00 p.m., Thursday, June 3 to 6:00 a.m. Friday, June 4; 9:00 p.m. Friday, June 4 to 6:00 a.m. Saturday, June 5; and 6:00 p.m. Saturday, June 5 to 8:00 a.m. Sunday, June 6. The Kenan Center cannot be responsible for loss or damage during the show.

Floor Aides

Floor Aides can deliver beverages and pre-ordered lunches to artisans during public hours. They will also be available to "sit" booths if artisans wish to leave their booths for short breaks.

Accommodations & Amenities

Enclosed is a listing of local hotels, motels, and campgrounds within reasonable distance of Kenan Center. If you wish to make reservations at any of these, it is best to phone ahead of time. Also listed are amenities in the area.

If you wish to camp on the Kenan Center grounds, an area near Kenan Arena will be available, as space permits. However, there will be no electrical, gas or water hook-ups. Men's and women's restroom facilities in the Arena will be available only when Arena Staff is in the building (Thursday 7:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m.; Friday, 7:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m.; Saturday, 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. and Sunday, 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.).

Parking

Participants may park on the east side of Kenan Arena for the duration of the Show. The public will also park in this area when other parking lots fill up during show hours.

Food Service

The Café will be open during show hours with the Shamus Restaurant catering food that will include salads, sandwiches, beverages and snacks. Pre-ordered lunches will be available for those who are interested. When you first arrive each day you may select and pay for your lunch choice and a floor aide will deliver it to you at your chosen time. A lunch order form will be in your Registration Packet.

Hospitality & Plants

During the Thursday evening and Friday daytime set-up hours and throughout the show, complimentary beverages are available to craftsmen at the hospitality booth adjacent to the Snack Bar. **Pizza will also be for sale by the slice after 12 Noon on Friday during set up.** Doughnuts and bagels will be sold at the hospitality booth prior to opening on Saturday morning. A variety of plants including, new this year, herb plants, will be available starting Friday at noon and throughout the weekend. Artisans interested in purchasing plants for use in their booth displays should inquire at the Hospitality Booth.

Door Prizes & Contributions

An exciting tradition at 100 American Craftsmen is a raffle of craftwork donated by our artisans. Each paying visitor receives a raffle ticket at the entrance, providing us with valuable demographic information and new additions to our ever-growing mailing list. The raffle also presents a great opportunity for you to attract shoppers to your booth. All door prizes are displayed at the front Information Booth with artist name and booth number, and both are announced when the prize is awarded. Prizes will be given only once each one half to one hour, so there will be fewer announcements to interrupt your business. **New this year - if the winner is not present to claim their prize, the donated item will remain on display, with a card indicating it has been won in the raffle, so that artisans who donate these items benefit from the promotion of having their work on display.**

Artisan Continental Breakfast & Meeting

A complimentary continental breakfast and meeting is hosted by the co-chairs at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday morning in the Café. All artisans are invited to attend and share feedback regarding the show.

JUROR BOOTH CRITIQUE

This year's jurors had extensive conversations about artisan's booth set-up, display and booth images. In an effort to assist artisans to be most successful with their booths, juror Thomas Stender, has offered a free-of-charge professional booth critique service to any interested artisan.

Topics covered in the booth critique will include how to maximize your space both aesthetically and organizationally. Stender will offer a variety of different display techniques that will improve both visitor traffic and experience. Other topics include lighting, backdrop and booth photography.

Booth critiques are optional and will take place on Friday, June 4, beginning at 2:00 pm. Artisans must have their booth set-up prior to the 2:00 p.m. booth critique starting time. Critiques will be scheduled in twenty minute intervals. You must sign-up to schedule a booth critique.

ABOUT THOMAS STENDER:



Born and raised in Minnesota, Thomas Stender began designing and making furniture because his graduate student apartment was empty. In 1976, having earned a B.A. from Lake Forest College in Illinois, a Ph.D. in English from the State University of New York at Buffalo, and a self-taught basic knowledge of woodworking, he began making custom furniture. He spent the next eleven years learning about design by reproducing antiques from the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries.

His furniture has been widely shown, published, and collected. In 1991, Mr. Stender began designing photo frames for Terragraphics, a subsidiary of Burnes of Boston, in addition to his studio furniture work. He has designed furniture and products for Modulus and t.a.g. in Chicago, Felissimo in New York, and other clients. He also writes, edits, and illustrates books about woodworking.

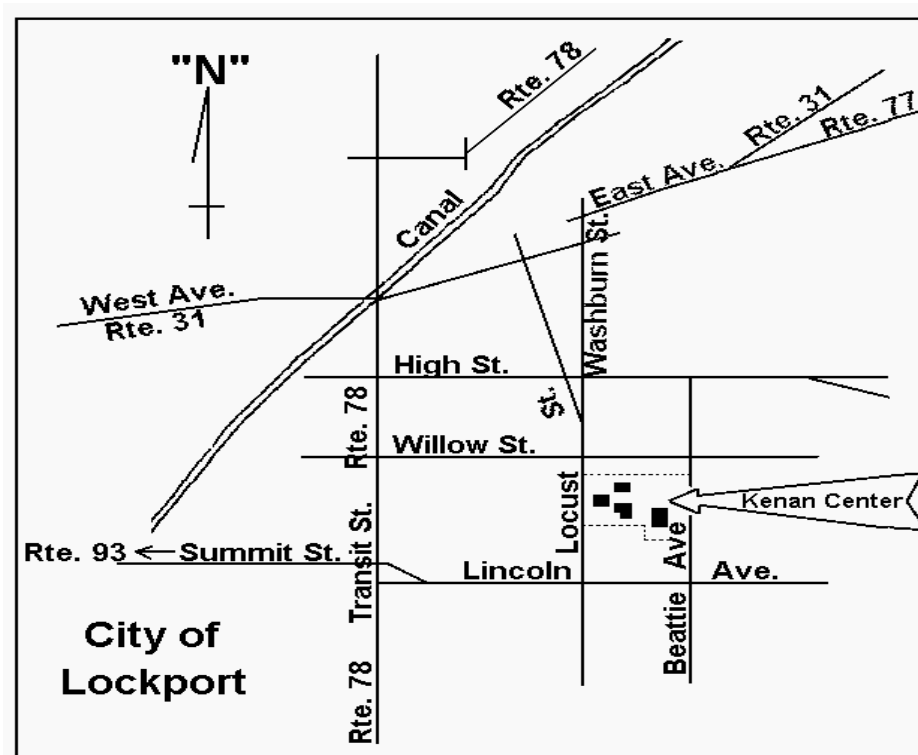

From the Niagara Falls area take Saunders Settlement Road (Rte. 31) east to the City of Lockport. In Lockport, turn right onto Transit Road (Rte. 78) and proceed south to the second traffic light, at Willow Street. Make a left onto Willow and proceed two blocks to stop sign at Locust Street. Turn right onto Locust. Kenan Center is at 433 Locust on your left.

From the Buffalo area take I-290 (Youngman Highway) to I-990 (Lockport Expressway). Proceed north on I-990 to last exit and turn left onto Millersport Highway (Rte. 263). Take Millersport north to end and continue north (left) on Transit Road (Rte. 78) to the City of Lockport. In Lockport turn right onto Lincoln Avenue (opposite the Comfort & Holiday Inns) at small park with gazebo on right and proceed to first traffic signal at Locust Street (Lockport High School on corner). Turn left onto Locust. The Kenan Center is at 433 Locust on your right.

From the Rochester area take the I-90 west to exit 50 - Williamsville. Take the I-290 towards Niagara Falls to the I-990 (Lockport Expressway). Then follow directions from the Buffalo area.

100 AMERICAN CRAFTSMEN SHOW CELEBRATES THE 40th YEAR OF THE ART OF CRAFT

The Kenan Center's 100 American Craftsmen show, first launched in 1970, has become one of the foremost exhibitions in the region for quality craft art and has remained true to that mission for forty years. The event takes place this year on June 4th through June 6th at the Kenan Center Arena, 195 Beattie Avenue, Lockport, New York, just a short distance from the historic Erie Canal.

109 artisans have been selected for this year's anniversary show, including four "master craftsmen," who are past recipients of the show's highest award. They are Bryan Hopkins, Buffalo; Jim and Pat Reno, Mayville, NY; Sally Danforth, East Aurora, NY, and Katherine Gullo, Portland, NY. Artisans represent eight states including New York, Pennsylvania, Texas, Ohio, New Jersey, Florida, and Massachusetts.
